**Comments:** Candidate's speech is well above 2 minutes. However, in real IELTS exam, IELTS examiner may not allow candidate to speak for more than 2 minutes. Candidate's sentence articulation is broadly correct. Her accent is neutral, but at some instances, pronunciation requires improvement. Candidate has answered all questions of the cue-card. Range of vocabulary is broad. Overall, task response is up to the mark.

**Suggestions:** Try finishing your reply in 1 minute and 50 seconds.

There is no need say "That's all". Closing sentences of any speech should be well articulated, thereby, giving your cur-card response a natural ending.

Practice using rich vocabulary words e.g. culture, profession, land of opportunities, fascination, tolerance, respect for human life, educated society, efficient legal system, first world country etc.

Practice recording more cue-cards.

Avoid using "you". Using "one" in place of "you" is recommended.
